Programs/Initiatives

Vigo County Drug Task Force⁸

The Vigo County Drug Task Force is made up of the Vigo County Prosecutors Office, the Terre Haute Police Department, and the Vigo County Sheriff's Department. It is charged with investigating drug cases in Terre Haute and the Vigo County area. The task force also supplies technical assistance to other Criminal Investigation Divisions.

Vigo County Court Alcohol & Drug Program⁹ The Vigo County Court Alcohol & Drug Program was created in 1979 and receives referrals from the court system. This program provides assessment, education, monitoring and referral services for these cases and keeps the referring Court apprised

Enforcement

- As of October 31, 2004, there were 157 law enforcement employees in Terra Haute (129 officers and 28 civilians).¹¹
- In 2004, Vigo County passed legislation restricting the sale of methamphetamine precursor chemicals, ephedrine, pseudoephedrine and phenylpropanolamine, as a means of limiting illcit production of methamphetamine.¹²
- Narcotics/Vice Investigations¹³
 This unit investigates crimes involving dangerous drugs, illegal narcotics and marijuana distribution and usage and all related intelligence.

Preliminary reports for 2006 state that there were 2 clandestine laboratory responses in Vigo County through June 14, 2006.¹⁴

Courts

➢ Drug Courts¹⁵

As of April 14, 2006, there was one drug court that had been operating for more than 2 years and another that had recently been implemented in Terra Haute. No other drug courts were operating or being planned in Terra Haute.

Treatment

The Hoosier Assurance Plan (HAP) is the primary funding system used by the Division of Mental Health and Addiction to pay for mental health and addiction services. Enrolled consumers are at or below 200% of Federal Poverty Level. According to HAP data, there were a total of 952 chronically addicted patients in Vigo County who received funding for treatment through June 13, 2006 of the most current fiscal year.¹⁶
