Dear American Representative:

One of the six pillars of the new way forward in Iraq which President Bush outlined on January 10th entails capitalizing on jobs-producing programs. Your business is proof that nothing generates sustainable employment like international trade and investment.

Trade shows jump-start commercial relationships, and there is no better moment nor venue than at **REBUILD IRAQ 2007**, in Amman, Jordan, May 7-10. Top firms from every infrastructure and services sector will exhibit to 13,000 trade visitors and key procurement officials.
