28 Immigrants to Become Nation's Newest Americans at Washington's Annual Public Service Recognition Week Exhibit USCIS to Highlight American Civics, Genealogy and Agency Recruitment at Exhibit

WASHINGTON – U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services Washington (D.C.) District Director Greg Christian will welcome 28 new American citizens from 18 countries during a special naturalization ceremony held at the annual Public Service Recognition Week (PSRW) exhibit on the National Mall. Of the 29 new citizens, four are currently serving on active duty in the U.S. military.

The citizenship ceremony will take place at 12 noon, Thursday, May 10 at 7th Street on the National Mall between Madison Street and Jefferson Drive. Greg Christian will give the *Oath of Allegiance* to the new Americans while Alfonso Aguilar, Chief of the USCIS Office of Citizenship, will present the keynote address. At 11:00 a.m., District Director Christian will hold press availability before the ceremony site for reporters. This is the first opportunity Mr. Christian has had to address the media since his appointment as the new Washington (D.C.) District Director on April 16.

The 28 new Americans are natives of the following countries: Afghanistan, Belgium, Bolivia, Dominican Republic, Egypt, El Salvador, Ethiopia, Guatemala, India, Mexico, Nepal, Nicaragua, Pakistan, Philippines, Russia, Thailand, Ukraine and Vietnam
