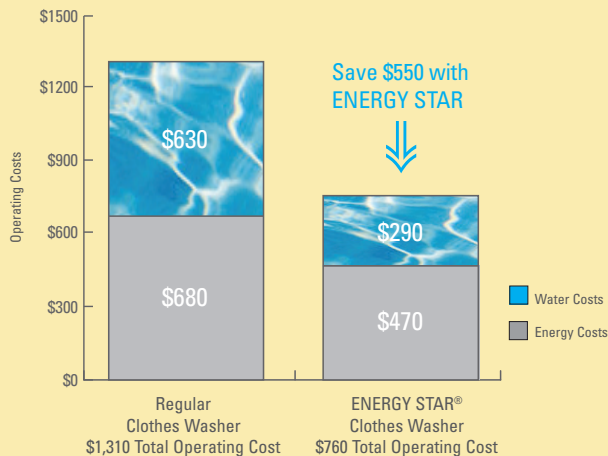

Though it may seem cheaper at first, a regular clothes washer can cost you \$550 more to operate over its life compared to an ENERGY STAR clothes washer.



How These Washers Save Water and Energy

Front-Load Models tumble clothes through less water, with no central agitator.

Advanced Top Loaders use sophisticated wash systems to flip or spin clothes through a reduced stream of water.

Efficient Motors spin clothes 2-3 times faster, getting more water out to cut drying time.
