At most Post Offices, the postmaster privately hired clerks and assistants; records of privately-hired individuals were not kept by the Department.

² Scipio A. Jordon/Jordan later served as a letter carrier at the Little Rock Post Office.

³ John W. Curry later served as a letter carrier at the Washington, D.C., Post Office.

⁴ George W. Evans later served as a letter carrier at the Louisville Post Office.

⁵ According to the April 29, 1894, issue of the *Boston Daily Globe*, William H. Dupree was the manager of Station A in the South End, and oversaw the work of 26 carriers and clerks. He was one of Boston's highest-paid postal employees at the time.

⁶ John K. Crump transferred to the Railway Mail Service in 1878.

⁷ According to Eric Foner's *Freedom's Lawmakers: A Directory of Black Officeholders during Reconstruction*, Josiah Crump was head of the mailing division.
