GEOGRAPHIC NAME AND CODE LIST

Geographic codes are shown primarily in computer-readable data products, such as computer tape and CD-Rom/DVD media, including data tabulations and data tables associated with computer-readable boundary files, but they also are shown on some U.S. Census Bureau maps. Census codes are used only if there is no Federal Information Processing Standards (FIPS) code for the same geographic entity or if the FIPS code is not adequate for data presentation. A code that is not identified as either “census” or “FIPS” code is usually a census code for which there is no FIPS equivalent. Since FIPS codes for American Indian and Alaska Native (AIAN) areas, are assigned within state, and AIAN areas cross states, the Census Bureau has assigned a national code to:

Alaska Native Village Statistical Areas
Oklahoma Tribal Statistical Areas
Tribal Designated Statistical Areas
State Designated American Indian Statistical Areas
