USCIS AND NELLIS AIR FORCE BASE TO WELCOME NEWEST CITIZENS

36 Active Duty Military Will Become U.S. Citizens During Air Force Heritage Week

LAS VEGAS – U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) and the U.S. Air Force will welcome 36 new U.S. citizens at Nellis Air Force Base on Nov. 6 in honor of the Air Force's 60th anniversary. This ceremony is the first all-military celebration to be held in the history of Nevada.

The Airmen, Marines, Sailors and Soldiers hail from 16 countries: Australia, Brazil, Canada, Cuba, Fiji, Guatemala, Haiti, India, Korea, Kenya, Mexico, Philippines, Romania, Thailand, Trinidad, and Ukraine.

Many of the service men and women becoming U.S. citizens have served in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan, including Purple Heart recipient Marine Cpl. Reuben D'Silva, who will speak at Tuesday's ceremony.

This special all-military naturalization ceremony is scheduled during Air Force Heritage Week to coincide with "Aviation Nation," the Nellis Air Force Base air show that is the capstone event of the Air Force's 60th anniversary, "Heritage to Horizons" celebration.
