Recommendation #23 Military Naturalization

On March 20, 2006, the Ombudsman recommended that USCIS eliminate fingerprint requirements for active duty United States military personnel in naturalization application processes.

On January 26, 2006, USCIS responded to the Ombudsman's recommendation. Although we agreed with the intent, we did not concur with waiving the fingerprint-based criminal history check at this time. However, we are working with the Department of Defense (DoD), Office of Personnel Management, and the Federal Bureau of Investigation to develop a fingerprint process that will make use of fingerprints taken for DOD purposes, to the extent possible, thereby eliminating the need for a soldier to appear for another fingerprint appointment.

The Ombudsman did not have any follow-up to the USCIS response and we consider this recommendation closed.
