Re: Chadmoore Wireless Group, Inc ("Chadmoore Wireless Group") and Nextel Communications, Inc. ("Nextel") Seek Consent to Assign 800 MHz and 900 MHz SMR Licenses (DA 01-1955)

To Whom It May Concern:

Prince George's County, Maryland is pleased to comment on the above-mentioned public notice. It is our understanding that Nextel and Chadmoore Wireless Group have applied to the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") seeking approval to assign 1,062 licenses in the 800 MHz Specialized Mobile Radio and the 900 MHz Specialized Mobile Radio held by Chadmoore Wireless Group to Nextel. As you know, there is concern in many jurisdictions across the country about the public safety radio system interference that many communities are experiencing with Nextel. To date, no solution has been found to deal effectively with this interference problem.


Although Prince George's County has not experienced any similar frequency interference with Nextel, the County remains very interested in this matter. At this time, the County does not have any helpful suggestions regarding conditioning the grant of assignments to Nextel. However, the County would greatly appreciate if the FCC will keep Prince George's County, Maryland informed of all ongoing matters related to this issue.


