GTE CORPORATION AND SBC COMMUNICATIONS INC. SEEK FCC CONSENT TO TRANSFER CONTROL OF WIRELESS LICENSES

GTE Corporation ("GTE") and SBC Communications Inc. ("SBC") filed applications pursuant to Sections 214 and 310(d) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. §§ 214, 310(d), seeking Commission approval of the transfer of control to SBC of licenses currently controlled by subsidiaries and affiliates of GTE. As listed below, these applications pertain to licenses for Cellular Radiotelephone Service, Personal Communications Services, Fixed Microwave Services, and International 214 Authorizations.

This transaction is related to the proposed U.S. wireless joint venture between SBC and Bell South Corporation ("BSC"). On May 4, 2000, SBC and BSC filed applications seeking consent to transfer control of most of their domestic mobile wireless authorizations to a newly created joint venture. Assuming that the transfer of control applications for the licenses listed below are granted, SBC intends to contribute these licenses to the joint venture, Alloy LLC. The applications listed below will be considered part of WT Dkt. No. 00-81, which relates to the transfer of control of licenses and authorizations to Alloy LLC. Interested parties are invited to comment also on the transfer of control of these licenses to Alloy LLC.
