Joint Application for Authority to Transfer Control of Section 214 Authorization from NorthPoint Communications, Inc. to Verizon Communications, **CC Docket No. 00-157**

Dear Mr. Glover & Mr. Metzger:

As you know, on November 17, 2000, Commission staff asked NorthPoint and Verizon to submit additional information relating to their proposed merger, including information on market definition issues related to bandwidth, service guarantees, pricing and demand for SDSL and T-1 services. On November 20, 2000, the Common Carrier Bureau filed a letter in the record that summarized this meeting and indicated that if NorthPoint and Verizon did not supply the information requested in satisfactory form by December 1, 2000, Commission staff would consider stopping the proposed 180-day merger clock.¹

Because neither NorthPoint nor Verizon have submitted any information in response to our November 17, 2000 request, we have elected to stop the proposed 180-day merger clock as of December 1, 2000, the day the information was due. Although Verizon has sought to terminate its proposed merger agreement with NorthPoint, the Commission has not yet received any notification that the transfer of control application

has been withdrawn.² Accordingly, because this is currently a pending Commission proceeding, we are stopping the clock on day 92, based on NorthPoint and Verizon's failure to supply the Commission with the information on December 1, 2000, as requested on November 17, 2000.
