## GLASGOW MAN SENTENCED TO ONE YEAR AND ONE DAY ON

Bowling Green, KY - BARRY EWEL BACON, age 43, of 230 Kino Road, Glasgow, Kentucky, was sentenced to one year and one day imprisonment in United States District Court, Bowling Green, Kentucky for possession of firearms by an unlawful drug user or addict and possessing marijuana and methamphetamine, David L. Huber, United States Attorney for the Western District of Kentucky, and Paul Vido, Special Agent in Charge of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), Louisville Field Division, jointly announced today. Judge Joseph H. McKinley, United States District Court, also sentenced Bacon to three years supervised release following incarceration. There is no parole in the federal judicial system.

Bacon had been found guilty by a jury on July 21, 2008. The jury determined from the evidence that Bacon was an unlawful user of narcotics and was in possession of seven loaded firearms when a Barren County Deputy Sheriff stopped the vehicle he was driving on November 8, 2006. The jury also found Bacon guilty of possessing marijuana and methamphetamine at the time of the traffic stop. In addition to the weapons, Bacon had 526 rounds of ammunition with him at the time.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Robert B. Bonar and Khalid Kahloon, and it was investigated by the Barren-Edmonson County Drug Task Force and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives.
