**PLEADING CYCLE ESTABLISHED FOR COMMENTS ON
 U S WEST PETITION FOR DECLARATORY RULING
 PREEMPTING STATE COMMISSION PROCEEDINGS TO REGULATE
 PROVISION OF FEDERALLY TARIFFED INTERSTATE SERVICE**

On December 15, 1999, U S West, Inc. (U S West) filed a petition requesting that the FCC issue a declaratory ruling that proceedings recently brought by AT&T before five state public utilities commissions seeking to set terms and conditions for the provisioning of service ordered by AT&T under U S West's federal exchange access tariff, are preempted by federal law. U S West states that the FCC should make clear that Title II of the Communications Act occupies the field with respect to complaints arising out of services offered under federal tariffs.

Interested parties may file comments regarding the U S West petition no later than **April 24, 2000**, with the Secretary, FCC at 445 12th Street, SW, TW-A325, Washington, DC 20554. Oppositions or responses to these comments may be filed with the Secretary, FCC no later than **May 9, 2000**. All pleadings are to reference **CC Docket No. 00-51**. Interested parties should file an original and seven copies of all pleadings. An additional copy of all pleadings must also be sent to Janice M. Myles, Common Carrier Bureau, FCC, Room 5-C327, 445 12th Street, SW, TW-A325, Washington, DC 20554, and to the Commission's contractor for public services records duplication, International Transcription Services, Inc. Comments filed through the ECFS can be sent as an electronic file via the Internet to <http://www.fcc.gov/e-file/ecfs.html>. Generally, only one copy of an electronic submission must be filed. If multiple docket or rulemaking numbers appear in the caption of this proceeding, however, commenters must transmit one electronic copy of the comments for each docket or rulemaking number referenced in the caption. In completing the transmittal screen, commenters should include their full name, Postal Service mailing address, and the applicable docket or rulemaking

number. Parties may also submit an electronic comment by Internet e-mail. To get filing instructions for e-mail comments, commenters should send an e-mail to efcs@fcc.gov, and should include the following words in the body of the message, "get form <your e-mail address.>" A sample form and directions will be sent in reply.

We will treat this proceeding as permit, but disclose for purposes of the Commission's *ex parte* rules. See generally 47 C.F.R. §§ 1.1200-1.1216. Parties making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must contain a summary of the substance of the presentation and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one or two sentence description of the views and arguments presented is generally required. See 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206(b)(2), as revised. Other rules pertaining to oral and written presentations are set forth in section 1.1206(b) as well. Interested parties are to file with the Secretary, FCC, and serve Janice M. Myles and ITS, with copies of any written *ex parte* presentations or summaries of oral *ex parte* presentations in these proceedings in the manner specified above.
