### **ATF Arrests Alleged Pipe Bombers**

PORTLAND, Ore. – The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) arrested two individuals today as part of the investigation into the pipe bomb that exploded in Battle Ground, Wash., Jan. 24, 2005. Matthew Campbell, age 18, and Bradley Brown, age 19, both from Battle Ground, were charged in federal court today in Seattle for conspiracy to manufacture an unregistered destructive device.

This was a joint investigation conducted by the Clark County Sheriff's Office, Clark County Fire Marshal and ATF.

If convicted, the penalty for the manufacture of an unregistered destructive device is up to 10 years imprisonment and a \$10,000 fine, and the penalty for conspiracy is up to five years imprisonment.

An individual is presumed innocent until the government proves guilt in a court of law.
