





 - Academic battle scars

 - Rules of engagement
 - Multidisciplinary vs. interdisciplinary think about ants from different nests.



- Staff
 - Faculty need staff support
 - Staff are not faculty
 - 1/3 + 1/3 + 1/3 = 7/3

- Research
 - Basic
 - Applied
 - Peer reviewed with dissemination beyond the university if it is not published... it's not research
 - Venue-driven
 - Research agenda vs. services
 - Use of human subjects IRB



- Tenure
 - Tenure is the motivating force for non-tenured faculty
 - Up or out
 - Tenured faculty
 - "Tenure run"

Mitigating the Cost of Testing Voting Systems

- Review existing model and protocols for testing
- Are they sufficient?
- Does the model lend itself to partitioning tasks and reintegration of results into the model?

 - What-if-ing (maybe, too good)
 - Organizing and retaining knowledge
