allows companies to track progress on entity-wide targets

Dept. of Energy's 1605(b) Program

allows companies to report project-based reductions and other information

Climate VISION sector agreements

- commitments range from 3-10% intensity improvements
- sector-specific protocols available for cement, aluminum, oil & gas, pulp & paper, iron & steel

Chicago Climate Exchange

14 companies agreed to reduce GHG emissions 4% by 2006



ISO GHG Accounting Standard

- split into 3 parts: entity, project, and M&V
- entity and M&V are moving forward first
- final standard expected in early '05

WRI/WBSCD GHG Protocol


- 2nd edition of entity protocol due out Sept. '03
- Project Guidelines due out fall '03
- A number of national programs: Canada,
 EU BLICC, Australia, others
- WWF Climate Savers, Environmental Defense Partnership for Climate Action, other NGO programs



- Registries in place
 - ▲ CA, NH, NJ, WI
- Registries under development
 - New England, IL, MD, NY, others
- GHG reduction mandates
 - △ CA auto efficiency, OR power plant CO₂ mitigation, MA, NH CO₂ cap & trade
- GHG reduction goals
 - NE/E. Canada, NJ, NY
