### UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

### S. 2663 (ORDER NO. 582)

1.—Ordered, That at 3:30 p.m. on Monday, March 3, 2008, the Senate resume consideration of the motion to proceed to S. 2663, a bill to reform the Consumer Product Safety Commission to provide greater protection for children's products, to improve the screening of noncompliant consumer products, to improve the effectiveness of consumer product recall programs, and for other purposes; provided, that at 5:30 p.m. the Senate vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S. 2663, with the time between 3:30 and 5:30 equally divided between the two Leaders or their designees.

Ordered further, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S. 2663 the mandatory quorum under Rule XXII be waived. (Feb. 29, 2008.)

### S. 1974

2.—Ordered, That upon passage of S. 1974, a bill to make technical corrections related to the Pension Protection Act of 2006, the bill remain at the desk until such time as the Senate receives a companion measure from the House.

Ordered further, That when the Senate receives a companion measure from the House, the Senate then proceed to its consideration; provided, that all after the enacting clause be stricken and the text of S. 1974, as amended, be inserted, in lieu thereof; provided further, that the bill be read a third time, passed and the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table without further intervening action or debate, and that S. 1974 then be returned to the calendar. (Dec. 19, 2007.)

### S. 2483 (ORDER NO. 546)

3.—Ordered, That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, following consultation with the Republican Leader, the Senate proceed to the consideration of S. 2483, a bill to authorize certain programs and activities in the Forest Service, the Department of the Interior, and the Department of Energy, and for other purposes.

Ordered further, That it be considered under the following limitations: that the only amendments in order be five related amendments to be offered by the Senator from Oklahoma (Mr. Coburn), and that upon disposition of all amendments, the bill be read a third time, and the Senate proceed to vote in the passage of the bill. (Dec. 19, 2007.)

### VETO MESSAGE ON S. 5

4.—Ordered, That the veto message on S. 5, the Stem Cell Research Enhancement Act of 2007, be considered as read and that it be printed in the Record and spread in full upon the Journal.

Ordered further, That the message be held at the desk. (June 20, 2007.)

### H.R. 3997

5.—Ordered, That if the Senate receives from the House a message on H.R. 3997, an act to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide earnings assistance and tax relief to members of the uniformed services, volunteer firefighters, and Peace Corps volunteers, and for other purposes, with an amendment that is not germane to the Senate amendment or the underlying bill, that the bill and its amendments be referred to the Committee on Finance.
