## S. 22 (ORDER NO. 13)

1.—*Ordered*, That at 9:30 a.m. on Wednesday, January 14, 2009, the Senate resume consideration of S. 22, a bill to designate certain land components of the National Wilderness Preservation System, to authorize certain programs and activities in the Department of the Interior and the Department of Agriculture, and for other purposes; provided, that the time until 10:30 a.m. be equally divided and controlled between the two Leaders or their designees; provided further, that the cloture vote occur at 10:30 a.m.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on S. 22, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived.

*Ordered further*, That the filing deadline for first degree amendments be 2:30 p.m. on Tuesday, January 13, 2009; provided, that the filing deadline for second degree amendments be 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, January 14, 2009. (*Jan. 12, 13, 2009.*)

## S. 181 (ORDER NO. 14)

2.—*Ordered*, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to proceed to S. 181, a bill to amend title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967, and to modify the operation of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, to clarify that a discriminatory compensation decision or other practice that is unlawful under such Acts occurs each time compensation is paid pursuant to the discriminatory compensation decision or other practice, and for other purposes, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*Jan. 13, 2009.*)
