### UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

### S. 4 (ORDER NO. 57)

Ordered, That on Tuesday, March 13, 2007, upon the conclusion of Morning Business, the Senate resume consideration of S. 4, a bill to make the United States more secure by implementing unfinished recommendations of the 9/11 Commission to fight the war on terror more effectively, to improve homeland security, and for other purposes, all time under cloture be considered to have expired and the time until 11:45 a.m. be equally divided between and controlled by the Senator from Oklahoma (Mr. Coburn) and the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. Lieberman) or their designees for concurrent debate of Amdt. No. 294 and Amdt. No. 325, and that at 11:45 a.m., the Senate proceed to vote on Amdt. No. 294, followed by a vote on Amdt. No. 325 regardless of the outcome on the first vote.

Ordered further, That there be 2 minutes for debate between the first and second votes, equally divided and controlled.

Ordered, That the bill be read a third time and a vote occur on passage immediately upon disposition of the substitute amendment (Amdt. No. 275), as amended, offered by the Senator from Nevada (Mr. Reid).

Ordered further, That the cloture motion filed on S. 4 be withdrawn. (Mar. 9, 12, 2007)

### S.J. Res. 9 (ORDER NO. 72)

Ordered, That with respect to the cloture motion filed on the motion to proceed to S.J. Res. 9, to revise United States policy on Iraq, the mandatory quorum call under Rule XXII be waived. (Mar. 12, 2007.)

### S. 214 (ORDER NO. 24)

Ordered, That with respect to the cloture motion filed on the motion to proceed to S. 214, a bill to amend chapter 35 of title 28, United States Code, to preserve the independence of United States attorneys, the mandatory quorum call under Rule XXII be waived. (Mar. 12, 2007.)
