## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

S. CON. RES. 83 (ORDER NO. 371)

1.-Ordered, That on Wednesday, March 15, 2006 at 9:00 a.m., the Senate resume consideration of S. Con. Res. 83, an original concurrent resolution setting forth the congressional budget for the United States Government for fiscal year 2007 and including the appropriate budgetary levels for fiscal years 2006 and 2008 through 2011; provided that the Senate begin consideration of the following amendments in the order listed below and under the listed debate times:

Specter Amdt. No. 3048-Labor HHS
Stabenow Amdt. No. 3056-interoperable
McConnell Amdt. No. 3061—relevant to Mendendez subject matter
Menendez Amdt. No. 3054-port security
Byrd Amdt. No. 3062-mining
Chambliss/Dayton Amdt. No. 3018-Byrne grant
Murray Amdt. No. 3063-CDBG
Ordered further, That the following amendments be offered on Wednesday, March 15, 2006:

Kyl-immigration ( 15 minutes equally divided)
Grassley-Medicare ( 30 minutes equally divided)
Nelson-Medicare ( 30 minutes equally divided)
Santorum-CDBG ( 30 minutes equally divided)
Ordered further, That upon the use or yielding back of time on the above amendments, the Senate proceed to votes in relation to the amendments, with no second degree amendments in order prior to the votes in relation to the amendments and the time consumed by votes under this agreement count equally against the resolution; provided further, that the votes occur in the order listed above with the exception of the Santorum amendment, which will occur following the Murray amendment and that the vote on the Specter/Harkin amendment occur at a time to be determined by the Managers, after consultation with the sponsors of the amendment; further, that prior to each vote there be 2 minutes equally divided for debate and that in each stacked series all votes after the first vote be limited to 10 minutes each.

Ordered further, That no other amendments or motions be in order during the pendency of this agreement; and that all quorum calls be charged equally during the consideration of this measure.

Ordered further, That the time during the recess at 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 15, 2006, for the Joint Meeting count against the resolution and be equally divided. (Mar. 13, 14, 2006.)

## S. 2349 (ORDER NO. 367)

2.-Ordered, That with respect to S. 2349, a bill to provide greater transparency in the legislative process, following the disposition of the pending amendments, the following be the next first degree amendments in order:

McCain-Santorum amendment
Feingold amendment
Ordered further, That notwithstanding the provisions of Rule XXII, second degree amendments be filed no later than 2:00 p.m. on Monday, March 13, 2006. (Mar. 8, 9, 2006.)
H.R. 22
3.-Ordered, That with respect to H.R. 22, an act to reform the postal laws of the United States, provided it shall not be in order for the Senate to consider any conference report or any House amendments to H.R. 22, if it would cause a net increase in on or off budget direct spending in excess of $\$ 5$ billion in any of the four 10 -year periods beginning in 2016-2055, as estimated by the Congressional Budget Office. (Feb. 9, 2006.)
S. 1042 , S. 1043 , S. 1044, S. 1045
4.-Ordered, That with respect to S. 1042, S. 1043, S. 1044, and S. 1045, that if the Senate receives a message with respect to any of these bills from the House of Representatives, the Senate disagree with the House on its amendment or amendments to the Senate bill and agree to or request a conference, as appropriate, with the House on the disagreeing votes of the two houses; provided that the Chair be authorized to appoint conferees; and that the foregoing occur without intervening action or debate. (Nov. 15, 2005.)
S. 295
5.-Ordered, That the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Democratic Leader, shall no later than the end of the first session of the 109th Congress or no later than March 31, 2006, call up S. 295, a bill to authorize appropriate action if the negotiations with the People's Republic of China regarding China's undervalued currency are not successful; provided that if the bill has not been reported by then by the Committee on Finance it be discharged at that time and the Senate proceed to the consideration thereof; that there be 2 hours for debate equally divided between the Senator from Iowa (Mr. Grassley) and the Democratic Leader, or his designee, that no amendments or motions be in order, including committee amendments, that after the use or yielding back of time, the bill be read a third time and the Senate proceed to a vote on passage of the bill, with no intervening action or debate. (July 1, 2005, Nov. 16, 2005.)
