Based in Nenana, Alaska, the Nenana Tribal Civilian Community Corps (Nenana\*TCCC) is a ten month residential program in which AmeriCorps members serving in teams carry out a wide variety of service projects throughout the state. The program is administered by the Tanana Chiefs Conference, a traditional tribal consortium of mostly Athabascan Indian residents of the 42 villages of Interior Alaska. Service activities include: home construction, disaster and fire response, environmental conservation and restoration and the creation and administration of tutoring, recycling, environmental education, and drug and alcohol prevention programs.

Members come from the Navajo population, and receive training during their service year to develop technical, professional and leadership skills.

Navajo Nation has the largest number of veterans per capita (numbering over 16,000) who have served in the U.S Armed Forces since World War I to present. This program assists veterans and their families have difficulty accessing services due to language (50% speak Navajo as their first language), cultural boundaries, and geographical isolation. To meet these needs, AmeriCorps members ensure that Navajo veterans and their families are accessing and being provided quality care services in the areas of health and unmet social needs. Members serve in five veteran's affairs offices across the Navajo Nation.

AmeriCorps members serve in teams of ten to carry out short-term, high-impact service projects within and outside the Hoopa Valley reservation. Service activities include: home renovation and repair; long term disaster relief; environmental improvement; mentoring; and large scale cultural site restoration projects.
