## **CHERAW MAN GETS 93 MONTHS FOR GUNS AND DRUGS**

Columbia, South Carolina ---- United States Attorney Reginald I. Lloyd stated that Floyd Sellers, age 50, of Cheraw, South Carolina, was sentenced in federal court by United States District Judge Terry L. Wooten to 93 months imprisonment for possession with intent to distribute crack cocaine, possession of a firearm in furtherance of a drug trafficking crime, and being a felon in possession of a firearm.

On December 6, 2006, Sellers was arrested for driving with a suspended driver's license. When he stepped out of the car, officers found that he had five guns, ammunition, and crack cocaine.

Sellers' criminal record includes assault and battery and drug possession

convictions, and he is prohibited by federal law from possessing a firearm.

The case was investigated by the Cheraw Police Department and agents of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF). Assistant United States Attorney Rose Mary Parham of the Florence office prosecuted the case as a part of Project CeaseFire, an initiative of the United States Attorney's Office that seeks to aggressively prosecute gun-related crimes.
