Program Goal

To reduce *gender-based violence* in schools and make schools safer for all students





Critical Program Components



Teacher Training

Student Life Skills

Community Counselors

Community Action Plans



Impact on Child Marriage

Child marriage emerged as a key issue.

Communities decide how to address the issue.

In Malawi, 35 child marriages were avoided between October and December 2007.





"Glory": A Second Chance

A 5th grade student, was forced to marry at the age of 13. She has now reenrolled in school after working with Safe Schools Community Counselors

Glory now attends school and has been trained as a Safe Schools "Peer Leader" to help other students live positive, healthy lifestyles.
