The Context

High national prevalence of child marriage in 2005

- 27% of girls aged 15-19 ever married
- 13% of girls 15-19 first married < 15 years

Low median age at first marriage for girls in Amhara Region

- Women 20-49: 14.2
- Men 25-54: 22.3

Negative implications for reproductive health, HIV/AIDS, STI, education, and gender-based violence

- World Learning/Ethiopia (WL)
- **Types of Interventions**
 - School-based
 - Community-based
 - Partnerships with national and regional legal/civil society organizations



School-Based Interventions

Girls Advisory Committees (WL) - Male & female students - Teachers & parents - Primary school only	 Tackle problems of non-school attendance with PTA Provides support to girls to ensure school continuation
Girls Clubs (PI) - Female students only - Primary & secondary schools	 Peer education on child marriage, HTPs, RH, life skills Support network for girls "escaping" early marriage Report planned child marriages to women's association & teachers Promote community conversations at social gatherings (e.g. coffee ceremonies)



Community-Based Interventions

Woreda (District) Advisory Committee	 Campaigns against child marriage Intervenes with AWA to stop planned child marriages
Amhara Women's Association (AWA)	 Organizes & train Girls Clubs Provides scholarships for poor girls Sensitizes communities on early marriage consequences & prevention Disseminates IEC materials
Religious leaders	 PI organizes workshops for religious leaders: child marriage, HTPs Sign statements condemning child marriage Exhort religious bodies to advocate against child marriage in community
Legal bodies	 Raise awareness of new legislation Enforce law




Community-Based Interventions Cont'd

Community-based Reproductive Health Agents (trained by PI)	 CBRHA sensitize against early marriage house-to-house Organize community gatherings Educate and mobilize at market places Intervene with AWA to stop planned child marriages
Partnerships with National and Civil Society Organizations - Ethiopian Women Lawyers Association	 EWLA provides free legal counsel to victims of marriage by abduction and rape Works with PI to train law enforcement agencies
- National Committee on Harmful Traditional Practices (EGLDAM)	 Develops training manual on early marriage, HTP, & RH Provides material support to Girls clubs Promotes community conversations Develops and disseminates BCC materials




Percent Correctly Identifying Legal Minimum Age at Marriage by Message Exposure, Amhara EMES 2007






Percent of Planned Marriages of Females Younger than Age 18 that Were Stopped, Amhara EMES 2007
