



THE GOING-TO-THE-SUN ROAD PROJECT TRAVEL INFORMATION

For the week of July 9-15, 2007

While alpine road work is occurring throughout the summer (mid-June to mid-September) 'shared use' of the entire 50-mile Going-to-the-Sun Road will be available, weather permitting. The alpine opening was delayed because of damages from heavy rainfall during the November 2006 storm. A temporary bridge has been installed east of Logan Pass due to the storm damage. Construction of a 350-foot retaining wall just east of the eastside tunnel was also recently completed. The roadway storm repair sites have been patched and paved.

When summer road work begins in mid-July, daytime travelers may experience several short delays (a maximum of 30 minutes for a trip across the road). Nighttime travelers may encounter up to 4-hour delays (10 pm to 6 am) during week nights (Sunday through Thursday). Please watch out for construction traffic.



PLEASE NOTE: July 1st through Labor Day, the new Glacier National Park shuttle system is available as an option for free transportation to locations along the road. Depending on the route, the buses depart every 15 to 30 minutes. The last buses leave Logan Pass at 9:30 pm. The shuttle system is not intended to accommodate large tour groups, which may need to separate into several buses and could lead to excessive delays for these groups. Stop by the Apgar Transit Center or St. Mary Visitor Center for additional information and park trip-planning resources.
