The original RFP is amended due to the following two clarifying revisions:

## 1. Page 7, Section III. ELIGIBILITY INFORMATION, A. Who May Apply, first paragraph, last sentence.

**Delete:** Organizations must represent communities that have not received a federal or state lead poisoning prevention grant in the past.

**Replace With:** Organizations must represent communities that have not fully benefited from previous federal or state lead poisoning prevention grants in the past. A community that has not fully benefited from previous lead poisoning prevention grants is defined as such when the lead poisoning prevention activities did not reach the entire community or where the activities of the previous grant(s) did not address the full range of activities identified for grants that are the subject of this RFP. If there have been previous lead programs, the proposal must describe how this project will differ and be able to reach children who are still being lead poisoned.

## 2. Page 8, Section III. ELIGIBILITY INFORMATION, C. Eligibility Screening Requirements: Threshold Criteria, 5.

**Delete:** Proposals from applicants who have received federal, state, and local funding to conduct lead outreach and training for a community in the past will not be accepted if the same activities are proposed for the same community in the proposal.

**Replace With:** Proposals from applicants must represent communities that have not fully benefited from previous federal or state lead poisoning prevention grants in the past. A community that has not fully benefited from previous lead poisoning prevention grants is defined as such when the lead poisoning prevention activities did not reach the entire community or where the activities of the previous grant(s) did not address the full range of activities identified for grants that are the subject of this RFP. If there have been previous lead programs, the proposal must describe how this project will differ and be able to reach children who are still being lead poisoned.

The closing date for applicants to submit a proposal is extended to April 12, 2007.
