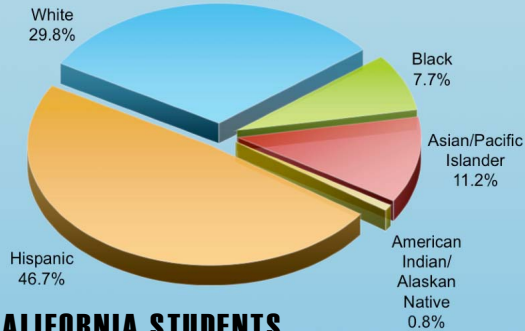

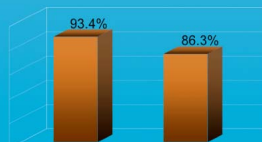

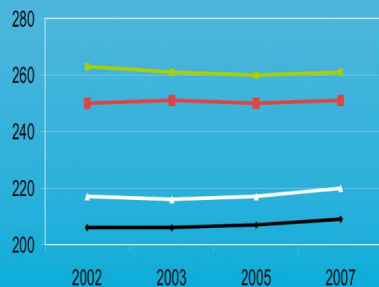

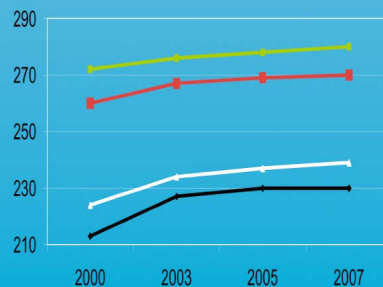

California Reading Achievement



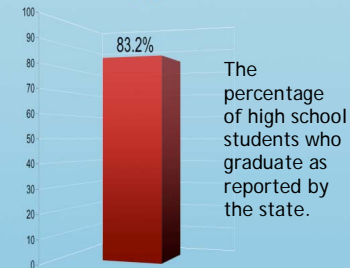
California Math Achievement

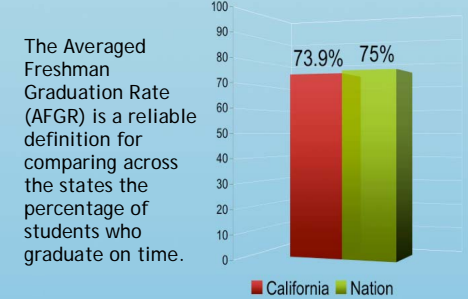
