Program Description

Title IV of the Air Transportation Safety and System Stabilization Act (P.L. 107-42) established the "September 11 Victim Compensation Fund of 2001." This law authorizes compensation to personal representatives of deceased individuals and to those physically injured as a result of the terrorist-related aircraft crashes that day. The Fund is administered by a Special Master appointed by the Attorney General.

The Act established a permanent and indefinite appropriation for making payments on approved claims. Through 2004, the value of approved claims is estimated to be \$5.1 billion. Of this amount, \$2.7 billion will be needed in 2003, and \$2.36 billion will be needed in 2004.
