Camp 32nd Ala Regt. Jackson. June 19, 1863

Lieut Col. H. Maury, Commanding

Sir, In the Mississippian of this date, I find Special Order No. 107 of General Johnston, Commanding Department of the West, offering amnesty to all deserters, for past offenses, "provided they come in without difficulty."

I have the honor to represent to you that there are about fifteen men of Company A now absent without leave, the names of some of which have been dropped from the rolls of the Company. These men mostly were residents of Washington County, Alabama. I feel well satisfied that if permitted to go after them and others of the Regiment absent under like circumstances in Clarke and adjoining counties, clothed with the authority contained in said Order, I could speedily gather a large number of them and return them to the Regiment perhaps in time for the anticipated active movements of this army.

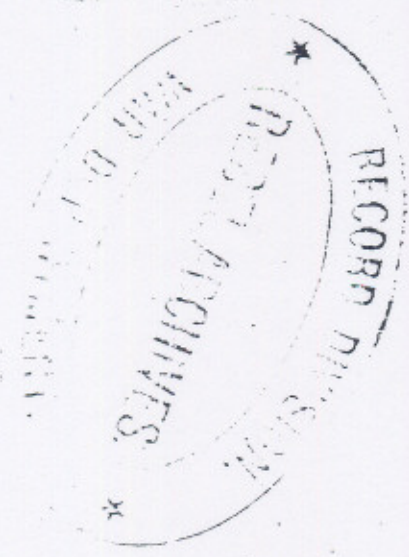
