DECLARATION FOR INVALID ARMY PENSION.

STATE OF Indiana }
 COUNTY OF Clinton } SS:

On this 15th day of April, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ~~six~~ 71, personally appeared before me, Wm. B. Bryant, Clerk of the Circuit Court within and for the County and State aforesaid, John J. Brick aged 32 years, a resident of Perry Township, in the County of Clinton, in the State of Indiana, who, being duly sworn, according to law, declares he is the identical John J. Brick, who enlisted in the service of the United States at Stockwell, County of Tippecanoe, State of Indiana, on the 19th day of August, in the year 1862, as a Private in Company "I" commanded by Captain Wm. B. Lambert in the 86th Regiment of Indiana Inf. 70th - and was transferred to Cavalry Corps Co. "I" 17-Regt. 2nd Div. Corps and was honorably discharged on the 30th day of June, in the year 1863; that while in the service aforesaid, and in the line of his duty, at a place called Stone River, in the State of Tennessee on the 31st day of December, 1862, he was wounded by a musket ball in the right hip at which time I was taken prisoner and abandoned by the enemy and then taken to Hospital No. 19 at Nashville Stat of Tennessee and remained there until about the 15th of January from there to Marine Hospital at Cincinnati Ohio and remained there until about the last of February or 1st of March - from there to Soldier Home at Indianapolis and remained there until mustered out of the service -

Since leaving the service he has resided Perry Township in the County of Clinton, in the State of Indiana and his occupation has been Farmer

when enrolled he was a Farmer And for the purpose of prosecuting his claim,
