Trophies: - We were shown this morning, by Dr. McCook, a fleg taken from the Rebels at the battle of Murfreesboro .-The flag is suspended on a short wooden staff, painted black-a very indifferent piece of mechanism. The flag is coarse buuting-white and blue. A cross appears in its centre. Upon the upper edge of the flag is worked, in large and very indifferently formed characters, "80TH ARKANSAS REGIMENT, -- FARMINGTON, KENTUCKY." On the lower part of the flag, in the same bungling style, appear the words "RIOHMOND, KEN-TUCKY" At Farmington, this regiment is said to have distinguished itself in an attack upon the forces under Gen. Pope—hence the first inscription: and was, also, among the regiments that outnumbered and surprised our raw troops at Richmond, Ky., under Nelson's command. The flag was taken by the brave Second Ohio, (Col. Kell, formerly of Steubenville,)-in the contest for which the struggle must have been desperate, as the flag is pierced with bullets, and stained with human blood. The flag (which looks like a relic of barbarism) was advanced in front of the 30th Arkansas three times, and the regiment fought up to it as often-but lost it finally in the last advance. The other flag, made out of muslin, Had not been long in use, as the colors are still bright. On one side of it is the instription, "8d GEORGIA REG-IMENT - DEFENDERS OF OUR HOMES." On the other appear the words "LADIES" PROTECTORS," from which we are led to infer that the 3d Georgia Cavalry was composed of gal-lant boys, as the regiment appeared to have the ladies in its special keeping. This flag, the 2d Indiana Cavalry, (Colonel Ed.
