of the County aforesaid, aged twenty nine
years, who being first duly sworn according
to Law, doth on her oath make the
following Declaration in order to obtain
the benefit of the provision made by the
Act of Congress approved July 14th 1862.
That she is the widow of Henry B. Phillie
who was Corporal in the Company com-
manded by Capt Handy in the 119th
Regiment of Illinois Volunteers in the
war of 1861. that her said husband
was wounded in the face at the battle
of Shufestborough in the State of Tennessee
and while at the Hospital near that place
to be treated for his wound was attacked
with Erysipalis of which he died at said
Hospital on the 23rd day of January one
thousand eight hundred and sixty three.
She further Declares that she was married
to the said Henry B. Phillie in the County
of Clark and State of Illinois on the



14th day of November A.D. one thousand
eight-hundred and fifty five, that her
husband the aforesaid Henry B. Phillis
died on the day above mentioned and
that she has remained a widow ever
since that period. She further declares
that she has three children, to wit Charles
A. aged six years on the 9th day of March
1863. Elizabeth J. born 29, January 1861 and
William B. born on 27th of March 1862
all which will more fully appear by
reference to the proof hereto annexed.

She also declares that she has not in
any manner been engaged, ⁱⁿ or aided
or abetted ~~the~~ Rebellion in the United States.

NOTES.

1. If ever served in any other organization give name, rank, Company, Regiment, and date, and place of discharge.
2. Or if any widow survived and abandoned any of said children, or is an unfit person to have charge of them, the dates and other particulars, or if she has died, the fact and date of death should be here stated.
3. If any have died, the fact and date of death should be stated.
4. There give the name and date of each child and the names of the parents of each child respectively.
5. If more than once married, the facts in each case should be stated.
6. If former application made, give name and number of claim and date of application.

Evidence of the marriage of the parents of said wards, and re-marriage of the mother, must be filed with such declaration. If the mother died, evidence of her death must be furnished; also the date of birth of children must be furnished; affidavit of attending Physician or nurse is the best evidence. In case the widow had obtained an increase of pension, the evidence or proof of birth of the children need not again be furnished. Certified copy of letters of Guardianship must be filed.



I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension Act 1862, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Henry B. Keille was enrolled on the 1st day of Aug., 1862, at Marshall Ill in Co. F., 79th Regiment of Illinois Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Corporal on the 28th day of Aug., 1862, at Camp Ford Ill in Co. F., 79th Regiment of Illinois Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. F. of that Regiment, for the months of Dec. & Jan. 1863, he is reported "Died of Wounds received at Battle of Stone River, Jan. 24, 1863."
