#### HISTORY.

The Ninety-Seventh Regiment, Ohio Volunteer Infantry, was recruited from the counties of Guernsey, Morgau, Coshocton and Muskingum. Companies A and B from Guernsey, C and D from Morgan, E, F, G and K from Muskingum, and H and I from Coshocton, and was organized at Zanesville, and mustered into the service September 2nd, 1862, by Charles C. Goddard, Captain 17th Infantry, U. S. A., and was mustered out at Nashville, Tenn., June 10th, 1865, by John W. Chickering, Captain 88th Regiment Illinois Volunteer Infantry, and was paid off and discharged at Tod Barracks, Columbus, Ohio, June 15th, 1865.

At the organization of the Regiment there were thirty-nine commissioned officers and nine hundred and twenty-eight enlisted men, making a total of nine hundred and sixty-seven men, of which number there were but three hundred and twenty-eight remaining at muster out, at the close of the War.

During the service of the Regiment there were fifty-three recruits received, and one hundred and seven men were transferred into other commands.

On Sunday morning, September 7th, 1862, the Regiment boarded the cars at Zanesville and was conveyed to Cincinnati to assist in opposing the rebel forces at that time threatening Cincinnati.

On the 20th of September the Regiment was put on board the Steamer "Emma Duncan," and after a tiresome journey reached Jeffersonville, Ind., and while there the famous mule stampede occurred, concerning which volumes might be written, but space forbids. On the night of the stampede the Regiment was taken across the Ohio river, on the Ferry Boat plying between Jeffersonville and Louiswas taken across the Omo river, on the Ferry Boat plying between Jeffersonville and Louisville, and became a part of the Army of the Cumberland, being assigned to the 2nd Brigade, 6th Division, 21st Army Corps, and thereafter remained an integral part of that army until the close of the war.

On October 1st, 1862, the movement from Louisville, Ky., against Bragg's army began, under the command of General Don Carlos Buell. This Regiment got started about noon of that day on the Bardstown pike and camped eight miles out from Louisville the first picht tind sore and worm out with the head ed eight miles out from Louisville the first night, tired, sore, and worn out, with the head of the Regiment in camp and the balance scattered along the pike for several miles, with blankets and overcoats decorating the fences, to the great benefit of the older Regiments of the Brigade, who profited by our unwise generosity. This Regiment was at the battle of Perryville, but not actively engaged, and assisted in forcing Bragg's army out of Kentucky. The Regiment took part in the battle of Stone River throughout the entire engagement, having its first losses in this battle, though not numerous. On June 24th, 1863, the Army of the Cumberland began the campaign against Chattanooga, and with the other organizations of Wagner's Brigade was sent through Sequatchie Valley and across Wal-

den's Ridge to menace Chattanooga from the north side of the Tennessee River.

It fell to the lot of the 97th Regiment to be the first Union troops to enter Chattanooga, September 9th, 1863, upon the occasion of its evacuation by the enemy. This was recognized by Gen. Rosecrans, who honored the Regiment for its energy and alacrity in this matter, by giving it the care and custody of the town in provost duty, thereby escaping the dreadful battle of Chickamauga, September 19th and 20th, 1863. When the army fell back to Chattanooga, after the Chickamauga battle, the 97th Ohio resumed its proper place among the troops, assisting in building forts and making an extensive line of entrenchments in and around the town to strengthen the position of the beleaguered army against which General Bragg, looking down upon it from his lofty altitudes of Missionary Ridge and Lookout Mountain, seemed loth to attack, but tried the more safe and prolonged method of starvation, by interference with our "cracker line," which, if it did not avail him much, was, to say the least, very annoying to us. At the reorganization of the army, following the battle of Chickamauga, the 97th Ohio was placed in the 2nd Brigade, 2nd Division, 4th Army Corps, and commanded respectively by Generals Wagner, Sheridan, and Granger.

November 25th, 1863, occurred the battle of Missionary Ridge, and the 97th took a prominent part in this remarkable battle, as well as the movement against Orchard Knob two days previous. The Regiment was placed in the rear line of one of the demi-brigades arranged for the occasion. When the movement against the Ridge began, and before the assaulting the Ridge began, and before the assaulting column reached the top of the Ridge, this Regiment had become merged with the front line and reached the top of the Ridge immediately in front of Gen. Bragg's headquarters,

effecting a lodgment simultaneously with other troops of the assaulting force.

troops of the assaulting force.

It was also a part of the pursuing force after the retreating enemy, and engaged them in another brisk battle about nightfall, a mile or so beyond the top of the Ridge. In the battle of Missionary Ridge the 97th Ohio sustained greater losses than any other Ohio regiment, having sixteen men killed and one hundred and thirty-three wounded. Wagner's Brigade suffered heavier losses than any other Brigade in the assaulting column. Following this battle the Regiment became a part of the force that went to the relief of Gen. Burnside's army, at Knoxville, Tenn., and made incursions into the enemy's country thereafter, to Strawberry Plains, Dandridge, and other points.

The cold New Years that people are wont to speak about, found this Regiment above Strawberry Plains, living in the open, with nothing more than rail pens and brush barricades for protection from the severe weather, and but for the fact that the men were toughened by hardships and exposure, many would, no doubt, have been frozen or incapacitated for further service.

Many who took part in the memorable advance on Dandridge will still recollect the masterly retreat on that Sunday night—raining all night and freezing as it fell—and on arriving at Strawberry Plains took at least two companies to form one gun stack, then across the Holston river, and on to Knoxville, and Loudon, where we remained for some time, then by rail to Charleston, Tenn., to guard the railroad bridge across the Hiawasse guard the railroad bridge across the Hiawasse river, where we remained until April 25th, 1864, when we marched to Cleveland, Tenn., remaining there until May 3rd, when we moved out with Gen. Sherman's great army in the campaign against Atlanta, reaching Catoosa Springs on the following day, and thereafter took part in the battles of Rockyface Ridge, Resaca, Adairsville, New Hope Church, Kenesaw Mountain, Smyrna Camp Ground, Peach Tree Creek, Atlanta, Jonesboro, and Lovejoy Station, and were under fire more than one hundred and twenty days in this campaign.

At Kenesaw Mountain, June 22nd, 1864, occurred one of the most disastrous days that the Regiment experienced, costing many lives and the wounding of a great many in an ineffectual attempt to change the picket line.

The Regiment also took part in the unsuccessful assault on the 27th of June, 1864, at which time it lost an officer of sterling worth in the person of Captain William Berkshire, of Company K, who was killed while leading his Company. He being the only commissioned officer of the Regiment killed in battle during its term of service. The Regiment has been ever proud of the part taken by it in the battle of Peach Tree Creek, Ga., July 20th, 1864, at which time it rendered such faithful and energetic service on the extreme left flank of the forces engaged, as to elicit commendation in general orders issued by General Newton, commanding the division, who directed that it be relieved from further picket duty during the remainder of the campaign, in recognition of the good work it had accomplished.

In this battle the effective work of the Regiment was shown by the large number of rebel dead that covered its front, while no casualties in killed, and only a few wounded were sustained by the Regiment, and only one of sufficient severity necessitating hospital treatment. In the siege of Atlanta, which continued from the time of the battle of Peach Tree Creek until its evacuation by General Hood's army, on the night of September 1, 1864, and our occupation of the city on the

following day, the 97th Ohio Regiment was almost constantly under fire, and sustained many casualties from rebel sharpshooters and stray missiles from the opposing army, notwithstanding the members of the Regiment protected themselves, as best they could, with barricades and "gopher holes" in the side hills on which they had position. Immediately preceding the fall of Atlanta the Regiment moved with the army towards Jonesboro, Ga., where another engagement took place August 31st and September 1, 1864, which movement was undertaken for the purpose of forcing the evacuation of Atlanta and control or destruction of the railroads, all of which was eminently successful.

After the fall of Atlanta the Regiment was conveyed by rail to Chattanooga, and after a scout through Wills Valley was marched to Stevenson, Ala., thence by rail to Athens, Ala., and from there marched to Pulaski, Tenn., remaining there until Hood's army put in an appearance on the north side of the Tennessee river, causing it to make haste in getting further north. From this point the movement began that culminated in the battles of Franklin and Nashville, Tenn., the Regiment falling back with the other Union forces through Columbia and Spring Hill, to Franklin where, on the 30th of November, 1864, it lad a conspicuous part in that sanguinary battle, after having been forced in from a front line of observation, and only saved itself from annihilation by the good running qualities of its members. Here is where we lost our Flag, which remained in captivity for twenty years. Then on to Nashville, where, on the 15th and 16th of December, 1864, was fought that important and decisive battle, in which this Regiment took an active part and aided in the annihilation of Gen. Hood's army. This was the only battle of the Civil War, in which the

97th Ohio was engaged, that the men of the line were made acquainted with the battle plan of the Commanding General, before the movement began, and it was successfully carried out in accordance with Gen. Thomas' directions tions.

The battle of Nashville was the last one in

The battle of Nashville was the last one in which the Ninety-Seventh Ohio Regiment took part, and the last battle fought by the Army of the Cumberland, to which it belonged during its entire term of service.

Hood's army routed was, with the remnant thereof, forced back to the south side of the Tennessee river, to be heard of no more as an organized force. Following this campaign the Regiment was moved to Huntsville, Ala., where it did provost duty in the town for some time, and in March, 1865, was conveyed by rail to Bull's Gap, Tenm., and from there marched to Blue Springs, Tenn., where we were when the news reached us of Gen. Lee's surrender and President Lincoln's assassination. Soon afterwards we were taken by rail to Nashville, Tenn., and formally mustered out of the United States Service, June 10, 1865, after having served our "three years or during the var."

Without disparaging the make up of any

without disparaging the make up of any other Regiment that answered the call to duty of the Civil War, there is no doubt that the 97th Ohio Regiment was composed of the best of Ohio's sons, whose devotion to their country, in its hour of peril, and to the duty assigned them, was fully attested by their prowess on the nineteen battle fields that illumines their history. In only one engagement—that their history. In only one engagement—that of the general assault on Kenesaw Mountain, Ga., June 27, 1864—were they unsuccessful. In this assault it was well demonstrated that advantage of position, strong fortifications zealously defended, are commonly impreg-



# CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

# 97th O. V. I. Regimental Association

# ARTICLE I.

Section 1. This organization shall be known as the Ninety-Seventh Ohio Volunteer Regimental Association.

SEC. 2. The stated and business meetings of this Association shall be held at the place and time agreed upon for the holding of the Annual Reunion.

Sec. 3. The object of this Association shall be to further the acquaintance of its members, to keep a Roster of the surviving members of the Ninety-Seventh Regiment, and to serve the members with such information as may from time to time be asked for. Lastly, to revere the names of the members of the Ninety-Seventh Ohio Volunteer Infantry of the war of 1861-65.

# ARTICLE II.

Sec. I. The officers of this Association shall consist of a President, three Vice Presidents, one Secretary, one Treasurer, and an Executive Committee of five members.

SEC. 2. The President, Vice Presidents, Secretary and Treasurer shall be elected annually by ballot or acclamation, as may be decided upon at the time of election by the Association.

SEC. 3. The Executive Committee shall be appointed by the President.

SEC. 4. All officers of the Association shall hold their office until their successors are elected or appointed, which election or appointment shall take place at the annual meeting of the Association, and seven members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SEC. 5. Special meetings may be called at any time by the President jointly, with not less than two of the Executive Committee, whenever in their judgment the interest of the Association may require it, giving, at the time of calling such meeting, the reason for such call, and the business to be transacted, and at all such meetings no proposition shall be entertained or business transacted other than that mentioned in the call.

# ARTICLE III.

SEC. I. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of the Association and all meetings of the Executive Committee, and in his absence either of the Vice Presidents shall preside as in their order named. He shall sign all orders drawn upon the Treasurer for funds of the Association.

ARTICLE IV.

SEC. I. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep in suitable books for the purpose, the accounts of the Association, together with a record of the members thereof.

SEC. 2. He shall receive all money due or paid to the Association, and pay the same to the Treasurer, taking his receipt therefor.

SEC. 3. He shall deliver to his successor all books and papers pertaining to his office, which may be in his possession at the expiration of his term of office, and perform such other duties as may be required of him agreeably to the business of the Association.

# ARTICLE V.

SEC. I. It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to take general supervision of the business of the Association. They shall also act as Financial Committee, audit all bills, and exercise a general oversight of the books and accounts of the Association.

# ARTICLE VI.

SEC. I. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive from the Secretary, for the use of the Association, all money paid to him, giving his receipt therefor; to pay all orders drawn upon the funds in his hands when signed by the President and attested by the Secretary.

SEC. 2. To have his books and accounts ready for settlement at each annual meeting and at the expiration of his term of office.

Sec. 3. To deliver to his successor at the expiration of his term of office, or upon resignation thereof or removal therefrom, all money or papers pertaining to his office.

# ARTICLE VII.

Sec. 1. Any person who served as a commissioned officer, non-commissioned officer, or private soldier in the Ninety-Seventh Ohio Volunteer Infantry, or as a Regimental Sutler for same, and having received an honorable discharge from the same between September, 1862, and December, 1865, is eligible to membership in this Association.

Sec. 2. Each member of this Association shall pay to the Secretary dues at the rate of fifty cents per annum for the support of the Association.

Sec. 3. Honorary members may be elected at the regular meetings of the Association, by a three-fourths majority of those present at said meeting, provided that not more than three shall be elected in any one year.

Sec. 4. No person shall be elected an honorary member unless he shall have served as a commissioned officer, non-commissioned officer, or private soldier in the Union Army during the war of 1861-65, and received therefrom an honorable discharge.

SEC. 5. Dues of any member may be remitted at the will of the Association, at any regular meeting.

SEC. 6. Life membership may be had upon the payment into the Treasury of the Association of the sum of Ten Dollars.

# ARTICLE VIII.

SEC. I. This Constitution may be revised or amended at any stated meeting of the Association by a majority vote of the members present and voting.

# ARTICLE IX.

SEC. I. It shall be the duty of each and every member of this Association to use his influence for the advancement, welfare, and best interest of the same. He shall furnish the Secretary with his full name, rank, and address, and notify him of any change of residence, and make provision for the payment of his dues annually.

# ARTICLE X.

SEC. I. The Executive Committee shall make such rules for the government and transaction of business (not otherwise provided for), as they deem necessary, the same to be subject to approval by the Association.

# ARTICLE XI.

SEC. I. As this Association is formed solely

for the purpose of social benefit to the memfor the purpose of social benefit to the members of the Ninety-Seventh Ohio Volunteer Infantry, and not for profit to any individual member thereof, there shall be no salaries or fees paid to any officer or member for the transaction of business of the Association to which he has been appointed or elected, except the Secretary, who shall receive such compensation for his services as the Executive Committee may from time to time deem just and mittee may from time to time deem just and proper.
