

**Federal PKI Legal & Policy Working Group Meeting  
April 21, 2003**

Updates from the FPKISC: there was a "Healthe Vet" presentation at the HCWG meeting on March 25<sup>th</sup> (veterans and physicians can exchange information in a secure web-based environment), there was a FBCA TWG meeting to discuss path validation on April 2<sup>nd</sup>, there was a CPWG policy mapping exercise with the State of Illinois on April 4<sup>th</sup>, a teleconference is scheduled for April 25<sup>th</sup> between the Government of Canada and the CPWG to discuss policy mapping results, the next FPKISC meeting is scheduled for May 7<sup>th</sup>, and the next FPKIPA meeting is scheduled for May 13<sup>th</sup>.

Liability language for Federal agency CPs is going to be discussed at the next CPWG meeting. Once approved by the CPWG members, the liability language will be discussed at the next FPKIPA meeting. Gene will also contact the Department of Labor program office and the Department of the Treasury program office for their comments as well.

Gene is working on incorporating non-mapable items from the CPWG policy mapping exercises into the MOA. Another concept being added into the MOA is Supplemental Requirements, representing things used in a policy mapping that aren't in the entity's CP. He'll also be adding an appendix to the MOA for special considerations.

So far, the Education Department has been the only agency to email information on ID proofing their employees to Bob. Bob suggested that Judy Spencer might ask the CIO Council to survey the Federal agencies about how they do ID proofing for issuance of credentials to their employees. Is there a common baseline for all Federal agencies or a straw man for Federal agencies to consider?
