E-Authentication Program Accomplishments

- First eGov initiative approved for Federal Enterprise Architecture and entered in the Federal Register – Authentication Service Component
- Developed Framework
 - E-authentication risk assessment tool e-RA
 - Technical architecture and interoperability (NIST SP 800-63) and uses standards based technology solutions (SAML & PKI)
 - Evaluation of identity credential service providers (CAF)
- Approved Products and Services
 - 8 Identity credential service providers
 - 13 SAML products proven interoperable (SAML 1.0 & 2.0)
- 23 CIO Council Agencies participated
 - 80+ applications
 - 1M+ annual electronic authentication transactions
