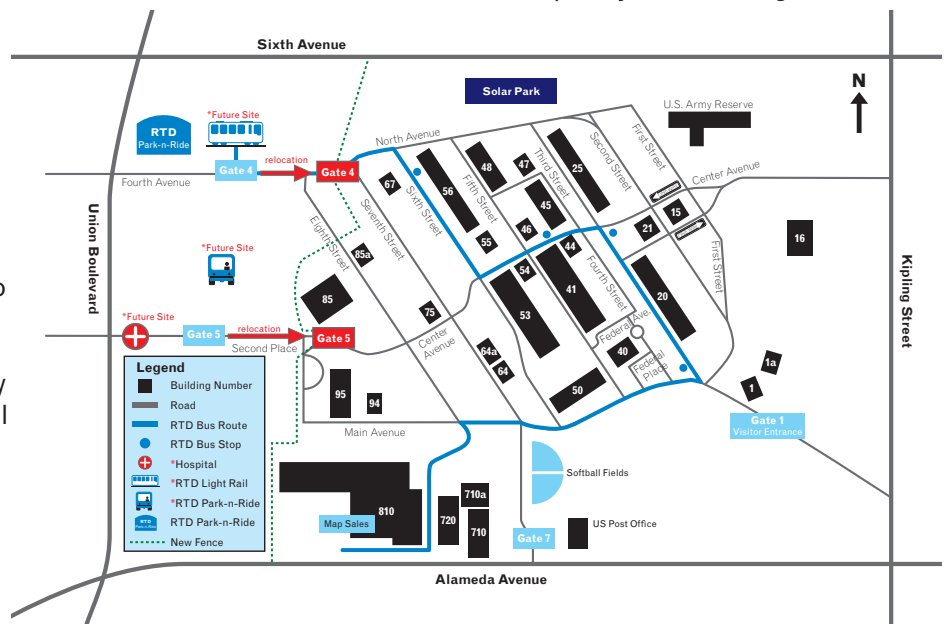
FEDERAL CENTER REDEVELOPMENT UPDATE

The increased construction activities on the west side of the Federal Center signal the continued bustle of redevelopment on the site.

Since breaking ground last summer, the construction of the new St. Anthony Medical Campus, just south of Center Avenue, continues on schedule. Foundations were recently completed, and structural work is evident along the Lakewood skyline. The main Orthopaedic Specialty Hospital is on target to open the second quarter of 2010, with completion of the full medical campus to follow in late 2011. The hospital

and its contractors are busy completing environmental remediation on the southwest corner of the Federal Center, just north of Alameda Avenue. This work is being done under the direction of the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment and GSA. It is necessary for official environmental clearance and title transfer of this parcel. Additional information on the new hospital project can be found at www.stanthonycentral.org.

The Regional Transportation District (RTD) is also starting work on the West Corridor light rail system and station at the Federal Center. Scheduled for April 2009, the western boundary fence line of the Federal Center will move further east from Center Avenue north to 6th Avenue. This allows for the construction of the new light rail system and Routh Street. The Gate 4 entrance will be relocated east to the vicinity of North Avenue and 7th Street, with a new intersection designed. In approximately April 2009, the permanent Gate 5 for the Federal Center will be installed just east of the current temporary location. Eighth Street

will be closed from the Building 85 parking lot to North Avenue. By second quarter 2010, when the new hospital opens, the RTD Cold Spring Park n' Ride bus facility will be relocated and operating at the new site just north of Center Avenue. The West Corridor light rail system, including the Federal Center Station, is slated to be open in early 2013. Over the next four years, there will be a lot of construction activity in this area as RTD prepares the site, and begins staging and construction of this exciting transit project. Finally, since completion of the new Federal Center Master Site Plan and Environmental Impact Statement almost one year ago, GSA continues to gear up for implementation of the 20+ year redevelopment plan for the site. GSA's regional and national offices are working closely on an implementation analysis and strategy for the Master Plan, to be completed in April 2009. GSA continues to work closely with the City of Lakewood, RTD and the hospital to ensure long-term compatibility of all on-going projects and to explore future partnering opportunities on the site.

Despite the slowdown in the economy, exciting progress on the Federal Center continues. As gate relocation and other events occur, GSA will continue to notify and work closely with tenant agency representatives. ENVIRONMENTAL NEWS

AT THE SPEED OF LIGHT

Sunlight travels to the earth in approximately eight minutes from 93,000,000 miles away, at 186,282 miles per second. Colorado is perfectly aligned to harness the power of the sun as we experience more than 300 days of sunshine every year. The Denver Federal Center (DFC) Solar Park continues to draw visitors and practitioners from all over the country to quench their curiosity.



The concept of solar energy is not new. History tells us that Da Vinci predicted a solar industrialization as far back as 1447. Colorado voters were the first in the nation to pass a statewide renewable energy requirement in 2004, and GSA took advantage of Amendment 37 passing. Construction of the park was complete in January 2008 and production started on January 3. The solar park's energy amounted to 3% of the total energy consumed at the DFC in 2008. It is producing 13% more energy than initially anticipated.

While the solar park is certainly one of the larger, more visible renewable energy projects taking place at the DFC, other green projects are underway such as

- A centralized recycle yard for construction waste stream recycling
- The installation of a sustainable groundscape at solar park
- An integrated irrigation control system with central tie and web monitoring and metering for DFC
- A solar PV car port to charge the Neighborhood Electrical Vehicles used on site

RECYCLING 50,000 POUNDS OF GRANITE

The GSA will be removing three underground well logging "calibration silos" operated by the USGS this spring. These silos have been used to calibrate tools that are lowered down wells to determine what type of rocks the well has penetrated. These tools are used in oil wells, deep water wells, and in wells used to find mineral deposits. Historic reports indicate that they were installed in the 1970s for public use at a cost of over \$2,500,000.

If you haven't seen these silos, they are located along the western side of the Denver Federal Center, south of North Avenue. They only stick up about 3 feet but they reach 30 feet below ground and are filled with granite cylinders that are eight feet in diameter and weigh up to 50,000 pounds. Each cylinder has a hole in the center in which rock logging tools are lowered. The original plan was to crush these blocks but through USGS exhaustive effort they were able to find a DOE facility that will "recycle" and reinstall the silos. This spring, GSA will bring in a large crane north of the hospital construction site to help remove the silos.

LET'S TALK TRASH: THE NEW AND IMPROVED RECYCLING PROGRAM FOR THE DFC

Over the last year our tenants have had many new opportunities to recycle with added services provided by GSA. We have received many compliments on the newest programs and continue to work toward reducing the amount of waste generated on the Federal Center.

The new programs include

- Battery recycling
- Single stream recycling
- Electronics recycling collection events throughout the year

We have also increased cardboard recycling by adding bailers at Buildings 41, 67 and 25.

Battery recycling

We placed collection containers at all occupied buildings on the DFC for spent batteries. Employees are encouraged to bring batteries from home as well from office use to be recycled. In 2008, we recycled over 300 pounds of batteries. Since October 2008, we recycled over 400 pounds of batteries.

Single stream recycling

We placed over 17 white dumpsters on the Federal Center in various locations. The single stream program allows for the collection of plastics, glass, paper, cardboard, and metals together in one container. Employees are encouraged to bring recyclables from home for drop off at any one of our on-campus locations. Building 41 is currently running a pilot program to collect drink containers and additional non-paper recycling materials from office areas to be disposed of in a convenient container located at the loading doc. Our goal is to provide single stream collection to all buildings on the Federal Center.

Electronics collection events

An annual electronics collection event is held each June for all employees and tenants on campus. Our next event is June 4, 2009, and we anticipate recycling more materials than last year. In FY2008 we collected over 23 tons of electronics material. Our recycling vendor this year is GRX. They are an end-of-use recycler and dismantle all electronics in their Denver facility before being sent to U.S. based companies for remanufacture. No electronics are sent overseas.

Cardboard bailers

Bailers have been installed at Buildings 41, 67 and 25. This allows us to collect more cardboard in a neat convenient bale. Baled cardboard retains a higher market value than loose cardboard and is in higher demand than cardboard that is not baled. We anticipate adding bailers at other buildings in the near future.

DFC TODDLER WING IMPROVEMENT UPDATE



The DFC Toddler Center will be undergoing some improvements. GSA will be repairing the cement

flooring in the toddler wing of the daycare due to uneven settling. Temporary fixes have been made, but a more permanent solution is needed. After completing various core samples and soil tests, a design was developed by structural engineers to correct the problem. GSA is currently working on the award for the construction, estimated to begin in April. Once construction begins, the project should be completed within 160 days. TAKING CARE OF YOUR ROADWAYS

GSA will be working on road and parking area maintenance during the late spring to early summer months. Maintenance will include crack sealing, striping of DFC roads and parking lots, and pothole repairs. For your convenience, the majority of work will be completed outside normal business hours.

Additionally, GSA will be working on sidewalk improvements during mid to late summer months in order to replace damaged areas. During this time, some sidewalks may be closed off for repair. For

GSA contracted the design of this project out to an architect and engineer firm and will be receiving the 95% design submittals soon. 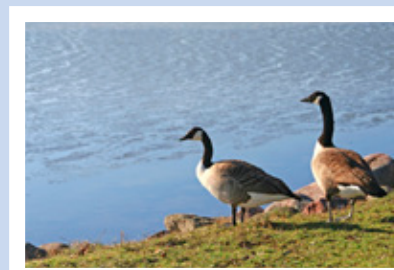

NESTING GEESE ON THE DENVER FEDERAL CENTER

Geese will begin building nests soon throughout the Denver Federal Center (DFC) Campus. As you are probably aware, every wild animal must be treated with respect for nature. No one should attempt to touch, handle, or feed wild animals without the proper training or a wildlife rehabilitation permit. Furthermore, because geese are migratory birds, they are protected by the Federal Migratory Bird Treaty Act. That means possessing, transporting for other than medical reasons, breeding, selling, or harming a goose, her eggs, or nest is a federal offense.



Geese mate for life and maintain a strong family bond. Nesting geese, in particular, may be territorial. Approaching a goose near her nest may elicit defensive behavior as the goose attempts to protect her young. If you encounter such behavior, you should move away and keep a safe distance.

As geese follow their natural instincts to defend their nests, they can be intimidating. They may hiss, chase, and nip in an attempt to scare away intruders that appear threatening. Although potentially frightening, these encounters are rarely dangerous and can be prevented.
