RECOMMENDATION FOR THRESHOLD DECISION:

Pursuant to 22 CFR part 216.2 (c)(2)(i), a Categorical Exclusion is permitted for "Education, technical assistance, or training programs, except to the extent such programs include activities directly affecting the environment..." Consultations to assist LAC countries in preparing and implementing comprehensive trade capacity building strategies on a national and regional basis entails technical assistance that does not effect the physical environment. Therefore the SO team requests a **Categorical Exclusion** for this activity.

BACKGROUND AND DESCRIPTION

The Advancing Development Cooperation Opportunities in the Hemisphere (ADCOH) Strategic Objective provides the Bureau for Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC) with the programming vehicle to respond to special development opportunities, foreign policy issues, legislative earmarks, and initiatives not presently covered by LAC Bureau strategic objectives. Activities under this strategic objective support: (a) innovative approaches to promoting cooperation among regional partners; (b) organizational strengthening efforts designed to improve the regional capacity to carry out development efforts; (c) special initiatives that respond to foreign policy issues but do not fall under an approved strategic plan; (d) organizations with the objective of expanding the USAID network of partners working on development problems in LAC. This Strategic Objective was approved in FY 2001.

DISCUSSION: The LAC Bureau currently has \$9.941 million set aside for the Hemisphere Cooperation Program. These funds will expire at the end of FY 2005. Trade liberalization in Latin America and the Caribbean serves U.S. interests by promoting economic growth, openness,

and democracy. The resultant stability and prosperity will strengthen our own security, increase economic opportunities for U.S. businesses and workers, and reinforce cooperation to address common problems. Funding for trade capacity building through the HCP and other programs is helping countries in Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC) prepare for negotiations, implement obligations assumed by trade agreements, and cushion the economic transition to free trade. This allocation of funding is predicated on the urgent need for resources to respond to capacity building requirements in Haiti, the smaller economies of CARICOM countries and Paraguay, and efforts to support new FTA(s) with Central America and the Dominican Republic, Panama, and the Andean region. The present activity is to fund the consultation process which is basically technical assistance.

Pursuant to 22 CFR 216.2 (c) (2) (i) a **Categorical Exclusion** is requested for these activities.
