The primary duties of this position are to perform routine maintenance and repair on the Staff Quarters. The incumbent will also assist higher grade employees in the performance of maintenance and repair on the plumbing, low voltage electrical, heating, ventilation and cooling systems in the Pine Ridge Hospital and Staff Quarters units. Secondary duties include training in refrigeration, masonry, carpentry, concrete finishing, roofing, painting, and other duties as assigned.
