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**Construction Management Firm Selected For San Ysidro Border Station**

**San Francisco, CA** — The U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) today announced the selection of URS Corporation of San Francisco, CA as the construction management firm for the Expansion and Reconfiguration Project at the San Ysidro Border Station in San Diego, CA.

The expansion and reconfiguration of the existing Port of Entry at San Ysidro will include work in both the primary and secondary inspection areas. Up to 50 northbound primary inspection booths will be added, as well as administrative office space, overhead canopies, and a new pedestrian inspection building. The goal of the project is to improve traffic flow, safety, and security for both travelers and the inspection agencies.

The estimated construction cost range is between \$100 million and \$125 million. The project is scheduled for completion in the Fall of 2011.
