Yes, colon cancer occurs more often among Native Americans than among other racial or ethnic groups. Most of the time, colon cancer is found in people age 50 or older, but people younger than 50 can get it,

## Colorectal Cancer Screening

- Collaborative Effort between
   Medical staff, Lab and Community Health CHR.
- Conducted (2) Key Indicator Studies (Performance Improvement) – May, 2007, and Jan. 2008.
- Study objectives are to: establish a baseline and successfully screen 22% of all active patients between 51-80 by identifying 'process changes' that result in an increased number of patients screened and to ensure data for screening done outside the clinic and patient 'refusals' are entered in RPMS.

# Colorectal Cancer Screening Process Changes


- Developed culturally relevant patient brochures
- Reported base line data to providers and compared it with peers
- Lab logged/tracked FOBT kits issued to patients and sent follow up letters
- 'Refusals' and confirmed colonoscopy referrals were entered in RPMS
- Care Teams discussed and promoted screening options with patients

## Cervical Cancer Screening


- (2) Pap Key Indicator (Performance Improvement) Studies: Aug. 2005 and Dec. 2006.
- Studies focused on getting women in for paps, improving the recall system for prevention, and ensuring follow up for abnormal paps.
- AAAHC Consultant reviewed studies and recommended further follow up and a more defined action plan.

## Gardisil Study

- Medical Department Key Indicator Study June, 2008.
- Study objective is to determine whether the high cost of Gardisil (three consecutive injections) prevents women from getting the immunization that protects against four of the major types of HPV.
- Targets women 13 to 26.
- We are working with a GLITC epidemiologist to assist us in this study.



#### > Chart Preview : Breast Cancer Screening








