

Hazardous Materials Incident Reporting Requirements and Incident Report Form

Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA), formely RSPA, revised the incident reporting requirements of the Hazardous Materials Regulations and the Hazardous Materials Incident Report Form, Form DOT F 5800.1. Effective January 1, 2005, the incident reporting requirements and form changed.

The final rule under Docket HM-229 (68 FR 67746) revised the incident reporting requirements and process of the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR; 49 CFR Parts 171-180) and the Hazardous Materials Incident Report Form DOT F 5800.1.

Note: The final rule became effective on January 1, 2005. Only the revised Form DOT F 5800.1 (01-2004) specified in this final rule will be accepted for incidents occurring on or after January 1, 2005. Filers must use the previous Form DOT F 5800.1 (Rev 6/89) for all incidents up to and including December 31, 2004.

Summary of Changes

The major changes to the incident reporting requirements and incident report form consist of:

- Revisions to the hazardous materials incident report form;
- Electronic filing of hazardous materials incident reports;
- One-call reporting of hazardous materials incidents;
- Expansion of reporting requirements to persons other than carriers;
- Expansion of exceptions to incident reporting;
- Criteria for telephonic notification;
- Criteria for updates to hazardous materials incident reports;
- Reporting of undeclared shipments of hazardous materials;
- Reporting of non-release incidents involving cargo tanks;
- Notification to shippers of an incident;
- Retention of incident reports; and
- New definitions.
