Landfill Gas Energy: A Sustainable Energy Source from Small Landfills in New England Workshop

Concerned about rising energy prices for your solid waste operations? Want to know how the gas at your landfill can be sold on the carbon market?

Landfill gas energy (LFGE) projects can offer local communities and businesses a source of low-cost, clean-burning fuel for both heat and electric production. In doing so, LFGE projects can provide significant improvements to both local and global air quality by eliminating methane emissions (a potent greenhouse gas) and reducing the need for higher-cost fossil fuels. Landfill gas energy can prove to be an economically sound investment in your community.

Want to learn more? This workshop will provide participants with information on renewable energy policies and carbon finance examples necessary to understand the potential for developing LFGE projects at small landfills. If you manage a landfill or have an interest in facilitating LFGE projects, this workshop is for you.

Sustainable Skylines Initiative Closing Date: December 17, 2008

EPA is announcing the availability of funds and is soliciting applications from eligible entities to

compete for financial assistance through the Sustainable Skylines Initiative (SSI). The SSI provides a framework to integrate transportation, energy, land use and air quality planning programs into projects that yield measurable air quality benefits in a relatively short period of time. SSI works with eligible entities to aid their communities to develop locally-led activities to help reduce emissions and promote sustainability with the goal of cleaner and healthier air. This is performed by participants working with EPA and other partners to increase community participation and leverage resources. The long-term goal of SSI is to help communities build self-sustaining, community-based partnerships that will continue to achieve positive environmental impacts, livability, and economic development benefits for many generations to come.
