EJ Small Grants Program Funds Available

On April 8, 2008, the EPA announced the availability of funds for the 2008 Environmental Justice (EJ) Small Grants Program. The application closing date is **June 30, 2008**. In 2007, \$1 million was awarded among 20 entities - two in each EPA Region. See EPA's EJ web site for more details.



Free Smart Growth Technical Help is Available! Are you trying to implement smart growth techniques? Are issues with policy and public engagement hampering your efforts? Do you need help?

The application period for the EPA Smart Growth Implementation Assistance Program is about to close. The last day for applications is **May 8, 2008**. Please click here for more information and application materials.

Experts will provide free technical assistance to communities, regions, or states, and will provide evaluation tools and expert analysis. Selected communities will receive assistance in the form of a multi-day visit from a team of experts organized by EPA and other national partners.



Nuts & Bolts of Redeveloping Brownfields

This training course addresses the issues and obstacles faced by Local Governments in redeveloping contaminated properties for productive reuse. Dates are **July 21 - 25, 2008**. Being held for the 4th consecutive year in Kansas City, Missouri, participants learn how many communities have overcome obstacles and stimulated successful redevelopment by characterizing and assembling parcels, cleaning up sites, and using public and private funds to attract redevelopment. The course fee is \$395 per participant, which includes a continental breakfast and lunch. Rooms are separate. Registration is now open and available on-line at this website.



LID for Big Box Sites
