Widespread heavy rain fell across across south Mississippi in advance of a deep upper level low pressure system and a strong cold front. Rainfall amounts ranging from three to eight inches were common across Pearl River and Hancock Counties. Street flooding was widespread and a number of vehicles, homes, and businesses were flooded. The worst flooding occurred in the Picayune area where 40 to 60 homes, 5 to 7 businesses, and 3 fire stations were flooded with four to six inches of water. In addition, passengers of a car had to be rescued after it overturned and became submerged in the flooded median of Interstate 59 near Picayune.

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
