Access 100,000 USAID-produced and -funded documents from your desktop computer through the Development Experience System (DEXS), an electronic library catalog which contains citations and selected full-text of Agency reports dating from USAID's inception. These include activity design documents, strategic plans, evaluations, research studies, conference proceedings, results reports, surveys, and contractor deliverables for USAID's programs on democracy and governance, population and health, economic growth, agriculture and food security, the environment, education and training, humanitarian assistance, and other sectors. Economic and Social Data Services and Desktop Statistical Data

The Economic and Social Data Service (ESDS) is the central source for statistical data analysis services and country-level development trend and performance indicator data on developing countries at USAID. ESDS regularly disseminates data from more than 50 major secondary international statistical data sources, in addition to the USAID "Greenbook" Data, either directly to its data users or more widely through its "Desktop Statistical Data" web site.

Research and Reference Services

The Research and Reference Services (R&RS) provides, current and historical, development experience information to USAID Missions, AIDW Bureaus/Offices, and development partner organizations. Services provided include quick-turnaround reference services, in-depth research, analysis and technical assistance services.

Performance Measures and Reported Results

This web site includes the latest (and historical) reported R4 data and documentation available to Agency staff. The information in this database is drawn directly from the R4 report submissions. Results reviews (R2A) of any R4 report can be downloaded electronically. Searches on reported indicator data can also be performed at this site. The website provides access to all R4 reports from the 1998 R4 reports through the present.

The database contains performance data from the 1999 R4 reports through the present.

It also includes narrative text from the R4s which is integrated with the display of the indicator data. The search function allows for phrase searching across all the R4 narratives. A companion Non-Presence Country (NPC) database includes records for all NPC activity information sheets submitted to CDIE as part of the Agency's NPC initiative.
