MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE AND

THE U.S. AGENCY FOR INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR DIPLOMATIC POUCH SERVICES FOR U.S. CITIZEN PERSONAL SERVICES CONTRACT EMPLOYEES

Whereas, on February 15, 2000, Assistant Secretary for Administration Patrick Kennedy approved full-pouch privileges for USAID's internationally recruited U.S. citizen personal services contract employees ("USPSCs"), the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Beginning ______,2000 , the Department will provide to eligible "internationally-recruited" USAID U. S. citizen PSC employees, full pouch privileges, i.e. the same pouch privileges as those extended to USAID's direct-hire employees under 5 FAM 300.
- 2. USAID will reimburse the Department for the cost of Washington-based pouch services for its eligible U.S. citizen PSC employees on the same per capita basis as that charged by the Department for the direct-hire employees of USAID, State and other agencies. The reimbursement will be obligated through inter-agency agreements.
- 3. Eligible USPSC Employees. Under 5 FAM 300, only those U.S. Government employees "assigned overseas" are eligible to receive pouch privileges. USAID makes the same distinction between resident (locally recruited) and non-resident (internationally recruited) USPSCs as is made for direct-hire Foreign Service employees.
 - Resident USPSC employees are recruited locally and do not receive repatriation travel or allowances under the Standardized Regulations.
 They are identified as "locally-recruited" " in the USAID Worldwide Staffing Pattern Report" and are not eligible to receive pouch services
 - Non-resident U.S. PSC employees are recruited internationally through an
 advertisement on the USAID internet web page, are usually hired by a
 USAID contracting officer at the post of assignment or at a regionalsupport post and are identified as "internationally-recruited" in the USAID
 Worldwide Staffing Pattern Report. They must meet the same
 requirements under the Standardized Regulations (Section SR 031.1) as
 Foreign Service and other US direct-hire employees being assigned
 overseas in order to be eligible for living quarters and other allowances,
 and their contracts provide a full repatriation package. These

"internationally-recruited" USPSC employees are eligible for pouch services.

- 4. USAID/Washington will provide the Department with the number of eligible USPSCs by post. USAID will also furnish such other information as the Department may request for administration of pouch services.
