- S. 2894, to establish requirements for private lenders to protect student borrowers receiving private educational loans. (S. Rept. No. 110–327)
- S. 1810, to amend the Public Health Service Act to increase the provision of scientifically sound information and support services to patients receiving a positive test diagnosis for Down syndrome or other prenatally and postnatally diagnosed conditions, with an amendment in the nature of a substitute.

Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act—Cloture: Senate began consideration of the motion to proceed to consideration of H.R. 2831, to amend title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967, the Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990, and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 to clarify that a discriminatory compensation decision or other practice that is unlawful under such Acts occurs each time compensation is paid

pursuant to the discriminatory compensation decision or other practice. Page S3188
