THREE POSTAL EMPLOYEES CHARGED WITH THEFT

Boston, MA . . . Three Postal workers were charged with theft.

United States Attorney Michael J. Sullivan and Joseph Finn, Special Agent in Charge of the United States Postal Service, Office of Inspector General, announced that three, one-count federal informations were filed charging **KEVIN F. MORAN**, age 23, of East Boston, MA; **MICHAEL T. CORBETT**, age 36, of Winthrop, MA; and **MARY PELLETIER**, age 43, of East Falmouth, MA. The informations allege that the three employees stole money and other things of value while on duty as postal employees. **MORAN** and **CORBETT**, who worked as letter carriers, opened mail and stole the contents; **PELLETIER** stole money while working as a cashier selling stamps and other Postal Service merchandise.

If convicted, **MORAN** and **CORBETT** each face up to 5 years in prison and a two hundred and fifty thousand dollar fine. **PELLETIER** faces one year in prison and a \$100,000 fine.

The case resulted from an investigation conducted by the United States Postal Service, Office of Inspector General. The cases is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney George W. Vien of Sullivan's Public Corruption Unit.
