I. APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR FPCA

The Federal Post Card Application (FPCA) is the primary form for requesting registration and/or an absentee ballot from your local election official. **Read all instructions printed below and on the FPCA before completing and signing your application.** Circled letters correspond to the circled letters on the sample form on the preceding page.

- A Block 2.f. and 2.g: Your full Social Security number is required only if you are a first-time voter in New Mexico. If you do not have a Social Security number, your New Mexico Driver's License number is required for first-time voter registration. If you do not possess either of these identifications, New Mexico shall assign a number that will serve to identify you for voter registration purposes.
- Block 3: Provide the complete street address of your New Mexico voting residence. A post office box is not sufficient. If your address includes a rural route, describe its location in Block 6. For example: "on Highway ______, 2 miles past Highway ______, across the street from the _____ gas station." This address must be different from the one provided in Block 4 and must be within the county or township where you claim legal voting residence.
- **⊙** Block 4.a: Print the complete address where you want your ballot sent usually your current mailing address. Your current mailing address must be different from the address you provided in Block 3.
- **Block 4.c**: See Section II.D. or III.D.
- Block 5: If you do not list a party affiliation, you cannot vote in primary elections. You must indicate your major political party affiliation when applying for a primary ballot (Example: Democrat, Republican, or other qualified major party) or write "none" in Block 5 of the FPCA. Political party affiliation is not required if only requesting absentee ballots for general elections. If you are currently registered and want to change your political party affiliation, you must submit a completed FPCA which indicates your new political party affiliation so that the local election official receives it no later than 28 days before the election in which you wish to vote.
- Block 6: Submission of this form serves as a request to receive ballots for all Federal elections held through the next two regularly scheduled general elections. If you do not wish to receive ballots for that length of time, you may request a ballot for each election for Federal office held in the next election year OR a ballot for only the next scheduled election for Federal office by noting your choice here.

G Block 7: You must sign and date the FPCA. When signing, you are swearing or affirming that the information is true and correct.

II. UNIFORMED SERVICES

These procedures apply to persons who are U.S. citizens, residents of New Mexico and members of the Uniformed Services and their family members. Uniformed Services are defined as the U.S. Armed Forces, merchant marine, commissioned corps of the Public Health Service and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

A. Registering and Requesting an Absentee Ballot

You should send an FPCA to your local election official early every year and whenever you change your mailing address (see Chapter Two).

New Mexico waives your registration.

To request an absentee ballot, the local County Clerk must receive your FPCA not later than 5:00 p.m. the Friday before the election.

B. Casting Your Vote

Ballot Return Deadline: Voted ballot must arrive at the local elections office before the **close of polls on election day.**

Local election officials mail ballots approximately 40 days before the primary election, 49 days before the general election, and 35 days before a special election.

If you have not received your state ballot in a timely manner, use the **Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot.** See instructions in Chapter Two.

C. Notary/Witness Requirements

No registration or voting materials are notarized or witnessed.

D. Electronic Transmission of FPCAs and Ballots

- New Mexico allows you to send the FPCA for absentee ballot request by fax or email. After faxing or emailing, submit the FPCA by mail.
- New Mexico allows you to receive the blank ballot by fax or email.
- New Mexico allows you to return the voted ballot by fax or email.

E. Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot (FWAB)

New Mexico allows the Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot (FWAB) to be used in a primary, general or special election where Federal offices will be elected. In order to be eligible to use the FWAB the County Clerk must receive the voter's request for a regular ballot not later than 5:00 p.m. the Friday before the election.

The FWAB can be used as a voter registration and absentee ballot request form in New Mexico if the voter is eligible to register and vote in the state. New Mexico waives your registration.

F. Bars to Registration and Voting

Persons who have been convicted of a felony who have not been granted a pardon by the governor or have not served the entirety of their sentence, including a term of probation or parole, and those persons who have been judged mentally incompetent by a court of law may not register to vote.

G. Action Upon Denial of Registration or Absentee Ballot Request

Upon denial of your voter registration application or absentee ballot request, New Mexico shall provide you with the reason(s) for the rejection.

III. CIVILIANS OUTSIDE U.S.

These procedures apply to persons who are U.S. citizens, residents of New Mexico and overseas citizens. The term "overseas citizen" means a U.S. citizen who resides outside the U.S. and (but for such residence) would be qualified to vote in New Mexico.

- New Mexico residents temporarily residing outside the U.S. (for local, state and Federal office ballots)
- overseas citizens (for Federal office ballots only)
