Reserve Education Assistance Program (REAP)

What is REAP?

The Reserve Education Assistance Program (REAP) provides education assistance to Guard and Reservists who have served 90 days or more in a contingency operation after September 11, 2001.

Who is Eligible?

Basic Eligibility Criteria (DoD and DHS [Coast Guard] determine eligibility to this program):

- 1. Must have been called to active duty under federal authority for a contingency operation as determined by Congress or the President.
- 2. Must have served on active duty in a contingency operation for at least 90 continuous days after September 11, 2001.
- 3. Must remain within your component to use benefits.

How Long Do I Have to Use My Benefits?

You have 36 months of full time entitlement to use. Your benefits begin after the 90-day minimum service period is completed. There is no time limit for using benefits provided you remain within your component. Once you leave your component or are discharged (except for disability), your eligibility to REAP benefits will end.
